This week's Torah reading continues to teach us the laws the Priests and their families must follow.

1. For which relatives can a priest enter a cemetery to bury them?

Mother, Father, son, daughter, brother and sister. (21:2-4)

2. Which women can the high Priest not marry?

A widowed woman, a divorcée, a profaned woman or a harlot. (21:14)

3. If a priest is blemished, may he eat the sacrifices with the other priests?

No. (21:17)

4. Who can eat from the sacrifices of the priest?

The priest and anyone in his immediate household. (22:11)

5. If the priest's daughter marries a non-priest, may she continue to eat sacrifices?

No. (22:13)

6. What day is designated for Passover?

The fifteenth day of the 1st month. (23:6)

7. How long do we count the omer?

Seven weeks, fifty days. (23:16)

8. What holidays are named in this week's portion?

Passover, Shavuot, Rosh Hashana, Sukkot and Shmini Atzeret.

9. May the menorah fire go out?

No, there must be enough oil in the lamp for it is burn continually. (24:1)

10. How many breads are in the show-breads?

12 loaves. (24:5)
