



TEN: Parshat VaYikrah

**This week's Torah reading teaches us
all about offerings and sacrifices.**

1. What is special about this week's Torah reading?
This is the first portion of the third book – Leviticus.
2. Where does God address Moses from?
The Ohel Moed, the tent of meeting. (1:1)
3. What does God talk to Moses about?
Bringing offerings (sacrifices) to God. (1:2)
4. How many kinds of offerings are mentioned in the portion?
Seven - Cattle, flock, fowl, Fine Flour, Oven baked, Pan Baked, and deep Pan (1:3-2:15)
5. The Israelites are instructed to put salt on the offerings, should they put it on the meal (flour) offerings as well?
Yes. (2:13)
6. What is different about a peace offering?
It may be male or female. (3:1)
7. If a Priest sins and brings guilt on the Israelites, what offering should he bring?
A young unblemished bull. (4:3)
8. When the entire Jewish people sin, who represents them to give the offering?
The elders of the assembly. (4:15)
9. If a person sins unintentionally – and it becomes known to them – what do they do?
They should bring a female unblemished goat. (4:28)
10. If someone steals, and they return what they stole, do they still need to bring an offering?
Yes. (5:25)
